# President's Message

Congratulations to Nancy McIntire, our Williams College liaison, who recently retired as Assistant to the President of Williams College and who has supported BILL from its inception. Welcome to Jo Proctor, Media Director at Williams, who was named by President Morton Schapiro as BILL's new liaison.

The stunning picture on the cover of the fall semester catalog is the forerunner of a full makeover of the public image of BILL. Inside is the most exciting curriculum we have ever offered. The Curriculum Committee members and Chair Arthur Sherman, along with the Catalog Committee, did a truly outstanding job.

Our logo, BILLBOARD masthead and stationery have all changed. The marketing effort is in full swing, and over time, you should notice a much greater presence of BILL in Berkshire County and surrounding communities. Funding for these and future efforts derives solely from the work of the Development Committee and is completely outside of our normal budgetary program.

It is clear that membership recruitment based on word of mouth communication is increasingly less effective, and we need to reach out to the very large population that has, surprisingly, never heard of BILL. They include many either fully or partially retired baby boomers who are moving to the Berkshires.

We are diligently working to address the needs of all our members as reflected in the survey taken last year. You will note an expanded program of stimulating evening courses, a varied program of special lectures and seminars and fabulous special events.

The budgetary efforts made last year both to increase income and reduce expenses have proved fruitful. It is with great pleasure that we have announced a reduction in dues from \$60 to \$50. The course fee structure has also been changed to encourage the taking of additional courses.

And so we begin another fiscal year. There is much to do. The officers, the Board and the committees are all working very hard to make BILL strong, imaginative, attractive and a wonderful place to meet friends and continue quality lifelong learning. Won't you join us?

## **Convocation 2006**

BILL members braved a heavy rain to attend this year's Convocation at Berkshire Community College. Mary Grant, President of Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts (MCLA), recounted a brief history of the college and gave an overview of its goals, projects and programs.

Pointing out that "learning to think creatively and critically" allows students to apply their intellectual skills in any area, Dr. Grant detailed how students are "joining self and service" by applying their MCLA experience both locally and globally. She noted that Senator Edward Kennedy, the 2006 commencement speaker, had been particularly impressed by the quality of the college's community service projects.

Stressing that higher education is "critically important," Dr. Grant stated that building partnerships with other institutions is a top priority for MCLA. These initiatives have included expanding relations with local colleges, encouraging exploratory visits by area high schools and creating an alliance with MASS MoCA. Joining with the Berkshire Compact for Higher Education has also increased the potential for MCLA's economic impact.

"We're in the business of creating hope," Dr. Grant concluded, and "not just for the 18 year olds." Her account of a recent 82-year-old graduate emphasized the message that MCLA offers exciting opportunities to anyone committed to learning.
